Hatchery Manager, Port Graham Hatchery

CIAA has an opening for a Hatchery Manager at Port Graham Hatchery, located in the village of Port Graham in lower Cook Inlet. Port Graham Hatchery was recently renovated and has a current production target of 84 million pink salmon eggs. Annually 67.2 million pink salmon fry are temporarily reared in net pens in front of the hatchery; with an expected return of 2.02 million adult pink salmon.

Job description:

This is a full-time, exempt, salaried position. The Hatchery Manager performs a variety of responsibilities. The primary responsibility is the operation and maintenance of Port Graham Hatchery. The Hatchery Manager is also responsible for directing all fish culture and maintenance operations; assisting with the preparation of the annual hatchery budget; preparation of hatchery reports and management plans; long-term planning and program development; supervision of staff and daily schedules and activities; and data collection. The Hatchery Manager supervises up to three regular staff and up to ten seasonal positions.

Qualifications:

The ideal applicant will have a Bachelor of Science degree in fisheries science or closely related field with two years in a management position at a Pacific salmon hatchery, extensive supervisory skills, demonstrated work history with increasing responsibilities, computer skills to include a working knowledge of Windows, Excel, and Word, boat operation skills, and familiarity with lifestyles and cultures in remote Alaska villages. Other combinations of training and experience will be evaluated on an individual basis for relevancy. A valid Alaska driver's license is required.

Compensation:

Salary range \$58,369–\$76,233 per year DOE. The benefit package includes health insurance (employee portion is a 5% co-pay), Health Savings Account with employer contribution, employee 401(k) retirement plan, vacation and medical leave.
