Assistant Hatchery Manager, Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery

Cook Inlet Aquaculture Association (CIAA) has an opening for an Assistant Hatchery Manager at Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery, located in lower Cook Inlet. Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery is not on the road system, but is accessible by boat or plane and has amenities such as electricity, running water, phone, and internet service. Employees are expected to live on-site in CIAA housing and may be required to work variable hours in support of hatchery operations.

Job description:

This is a full-time, exempt, salaried position. Under the supervision of the Hatchery Manager, this position performs a variety of responsibilities including, but not limited to:

- Assisting with fish production including egg take, egg pick, sorting, rearing, incubation tasks, and pathology sampling.
- Assisting with on-site maintenance of buildings, grounds, and equipment.
- Responding to water, process, and emergency alarms.
- Directing Fish Culturists, Technicians, and Seasonal Assistants.
- Sharing standby responsibilities with the Hatchery Manager and Fish Culturists.
- Assisting with keeping records of maintenance, water temperatures, and fish production.
- Operating boats, Bobcat, Backhoe, and UTV.
- Providing boat, UTV, and equipment training to seasonal assistants.
- Conducting safety inspections, maintaining a safe working environment, and providing safety training and orientation as directed by the Hatchery Manager.
- Responsible for all hatchery operations when the Hatchery Manager is offsite.
- Escorting visitors on hatchery tours.

Qualifications:

The ideal candidate will have a working knowledge of applied fishery biology, cold water fish hatchery operations, basic construction techniques and boat operations; a current CPR and First Aid certification; the ability to work in cold, windy, rainy conditions and in lowlight rooms with a headlamp; and the ability to live in a remote setting with limited access to other resources. Mechanical skills, strong verbal and written communication skills, quick on-the-spot decision making, and familiarity with computers and software such as Microsoft Excel, Word, and Outlook are desirable. Other combinations of training and experience will be evaluated on an individual basis for relevancy.
