Seasonal Assistants (seven), Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery

Closing date: July 31, 2017

CIAA has seven openings for Seasonal Assistants at Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery. This is a remote site located in Tutka Bay Lagoon, accessible by water. The location of hire is Kenai. CIAA will provide travel from Kenai to Tutka Bay Lagoon, as well as accommodations and food for the length of employment.

These positions are expected to start on August 4, 2017 and end September 22, 2017. Length of employment is dependent upon fish returns. If fish are less than predicted, length of employment may be shortened.

Job description:

These are full-time, temporary, non-exempt positions. Under the direction of the Hatchery Manager or Assistant Hatchery Manager, the Seasonal Assistant position will assist with pink salmon broodstock collection, egg takes, and incubation as well as maintenance of the hatchery and its equipment.

Qualifications:

Must be able to live in remote locations, work outdoors in inclement weather and in harmony with fellow employees, operate fishery and water quality sampling gear, and have a working knowledge of basic construction techniques. The use of hand tools, outboard motor and small skiff operation, and outdoor skills are required. Familiarity with sampling and data recording techniques is desirable. Requires the ability to lift, carry, push or pull up to 50 lbs. Must be willing to work long hours. Current CPR and first aid certifications are required.

Compensation:

\$13.00 per hour, overtime eligible.
